## North East India Scenario: Sports & Entertainment Sector Highlights

#### **Sports**

Northeast India, which constitutes approximately 8 percent of India's landmass and 3.8 percent of its population, has earned a reputation for producing some of the finest athletes and sports persons who consistently contribute to India's success in prestigious tournaments like the Olympics and Commonwealth Games. In addition, sports serve as a crucial tool for community building in this region, which is home to around 200 ethnic communities.

Northeast India has been producing celebrated international players for years. Bhaichung Bhutia, from Sikkim, was the first Indian footballer to sign a contract with a European club, in 1999. Bhutia, is credited with taking Indian football to the international arena and played a pivotal role in India winning the Nehru Cup, LG Cup, and SAFF Championship, among other tournaments.

MC Mary Kom from Manipur is another remarkable athlete who holds the distinction of being the only female boxer to have qualified for the 2012 Summer Olympics and the only female boxer to have won the World Amateur Boxing Championship six times. She also became the first woman to win a gold medal in the Asian Games. K Sanjita Chanu from Manipur, sprinter Hima Das from Assam, Lovlina Borgohain from Assam, Jeremy Lalrinnunga from Mizoram, Saikhom Mirabai Chanu, Bidyarani Devi Sorokhaibam, and Nayanmani Saikia are other outstanding athletes from the region who have brought laurels to India, including at the Olympics and Commonwealth Games.

- North-eastern region holds only 3.1% of the population of India, but 6.72% of the athletes representing India in Rio 2016 Olympics belonged to North-eastern Region.
- In 2020, Mizoram became the first state of India to have accorded 'Industry standard' to sports.
- North Eastern States have Sports Policies to guide and frame schemes for various matters related to sports
- Under the Khelo India Scheme, Rs. 439.51 crore were sanctioned in 2021 to develop 64 sports infrastructure projects in the Northeast.
- Under the Khelo India Scheme, 08 Khelo India State Centres of Excellence and 152 Khelo India Centres have been sanctioned in the North Eastern Region.
- Further, 22 sports academies have also been accredited and 02 Army Boys Sports Companies are being supported in the North Eastern Region.
- A total of 195 Khelo India Athletes have been identified from the North Eastern Region until 2022.
- A National Sports University has been established in Imphal in Manipur which provides courses on sports science, sports technology, sports management and sports coaching.
- In addition, a North Eastern Regional Centre of Lakshmibai National Institute of Physical Education (LNIPE) is also operational since 2009-10 in Guwahati, Assam.

#### **Entertainment**

Northeast India provides a picturesque backdrop for entertainment productions, with its serene landscapes ideal for song sequences, dramatic settings perfect for thrilling action scenes, and quaint villages for emotive storytelling. Numerous Bollywood movies and songs have been filmed in various scenic locations across the region, including the popular Tanhai Tanhai song from Koyla, Dil Se starring Shahrukh Khan, Daman starring Raveena Tandon, Rock On 2 starring Farhan Akhtar, Rangoon starring Kangana Ranaut, Anek starring Ayushmann Khurana, and Bhediya starring Varun Dhawan. In 2014, a Hindi feature film on Olympic medallist boxer MC Mary Kom was also filmed in the area.

Several production houses and entertainment agencies in Northeast India produce movies, short films, videos, and daily soaps in local languages, catering to audiences across all the North Eastern States. With the increasing penetration of the internet in the region, OTT platforms and online streaming portals have gained popularity, attracting a growing viewership. The rise of internet accessibility has also spurred the creation of locally-produced content in various genres. OTT platforms such as Netflix, Amazon Prime, Hotstar, Zee5, and others have developed a significant viewership base in the Northeast, particularly in Assam.




Theatre is another popular and revenue-generating industries in the North East, especially in Assam and Manipur. Since 1963, almost two hundred mobile theatre groups have been entertaining Assamese audiences. Today, there are 32 mobile theatre groups in Assam alone

- Traditional theatre forms are an essential part of the cultural heritage of the Northeastern states of India. These art forms have a rich history and continue to play a crucial role in shaping the region's cultural identity.
- In Assam, the traditional theatre form is known as Bhaona, which dates back to the 15th century. Bhaona is a religious theatre that depicts stories from Hindu mythology, primarily focusing on the life of Lord Krishna. The performances are accompanied by music, dance, and intricate costumes, and the actors wear masks and use hand gestures to convey emotions and expressions. Bhaona is performed in Satras, religious institutions established by Vaishnavite saints of Assam.
- Apart from Bhaona, Assam also has other forms of theatre, such as Ankia Naat, introduced by the medieval saint and poet Srimanta Sankardeva. Ankia Naat is a one-act play that combines drama, music, and dance, and it portrays moral and ethical values.
- In Manipur, there is a unique form of theatre called Manipuri theatre or Jagoi, which combines dance, music, and drama. The performances take place in a circular arena called a mandap, and they depict stories from Manipuri mythology and history. Traditional musical instruments such as the pung, a drum made of wood and leather, accompany the performances.
- Apart from Assamese and Manipuri theatre, the Northeastern region has many forms of folk theatre, including ritualistic dance forms such as the harvest dance, seed-sowing dance, and war dance. These dances are performed in villages according to the season and situation and are a form of folk theatre.

The theatrical performances of the region, such as Yak Chaam and Enchey Chaam or mask dance of Sikkim; Lion dance, Ponung dance, Tam-ladu dance, and Si-donyi dance of Arunachal Pradesh; Oja-pali and Ankhiya Nat of Assam; Behdienkhlam dance, Wangala dance, and Nongkrem dance of Meghalaya; War-Dance and Seed-Sowing-Dances of Nagaland; Lai-haraoba dance of Manipur; Garia, and Mamita of Tripura; Khuallam and Cheraw or Bamboo Dance of Mizoram, all showcase the rich tradition of theatrical art in NER





- Partnerships with traditional institutions like Satras: Investors esp. from Tourism Industry can partner with institutions like Satras and organize regular Bhaona performances for tourists and locals alike. Such partnerships can be profitable for investors, as well as the local community with revenues from ticket sales and merchandise sales, including traditional costumes, masks, and handicrafts
- Organizing shows in metropolitan cities: Businesses can organise colourful and interesting shows and exposition events to showcase Bhaona, Ankiya Naat, Jagoi etc In other cities in India and even abroad. Festivals organised by various private promoters and advertising agencies outside the country have previously been very successful in hogging the limelight as well in mobilising sponsorships
- Organizing shows and festivals centred around the cultural components of Traditional Theatre: Special interest festivals can be planned around the concept of traditional theaters involving other elements as well in the states which can be a fruitful investment in terms of gaining ticketed sales, sponsorships etc. With partnerships with state tourism departments the same can be very successful as has been the case of numerous festivals in the NER.



North East is also home to numerous music and cultural festivals which has gained immense popularity nationally & internationally. These festivals attract tourists from all states of the Country and also overseas.

- **Ziro Music Festival, Arunachal Pradesh:** A four-day annual concert held in the beautiful Ziro valley by the indigenous Apatani tribe, the eco-friendly festival emphasizes building a creative community and engaging with the local folk. It has grown to become the largest non-pilgrimage tourist event in Arunachal Pradesh, attracting a loyal global audience.
- Hornbill Festival, Nagaland: A ten-day annual event that showcases Nagaland's rich and diverse cultural heritage and promotes tourism in the state. The festival offers visitors a chance to experience adventure, sports, art, handicrafts, fashion, music, literature, and more.
- **Temi Tea Autumn Festival, Sikkim:** This unique carnival celebrates the natural beauty of cherry blossoms and organic tea produced at the famous "Temi Tea Estate" in South Sikkim. It offers adventure activities, photography competitions, cultural programs, and a mesmerizing view of blooming cherry blossoms against the backdrop of the Kanchenjunga peak.
- **Rongali Festival, Assam:** A festival that promotes the music, dance, crafts, and food culture of Assam, and showcases the state's ethnic diversity. The festival features an exhibition of rich handloom, crafts, organic Agri-horti products, art, and photography.
- Raas Leela Festival, Assam: A festival celebrated in Majuli, the lone place in Assam where the Raas Leela of Lord Krishna is enacted by the devout. It offers mouth-watering delicacies of traditional, tribal, and native Assamese cuisine, as well as exhibitions that display articles reflecting the rich tradition of the state.
- Cherry Blossom Festival, Meghalaya: A multi-day and multi-event festival held during the autumn flowering of the famous cherry blossom trees in and around Shillong. The festival offers a beautiful natural stage for experiencing modern and traditional aspects of Meghalayan culture.
- Shirui Lily Festival, Manipur: A festival celebrated in honour of the state flower, Shirui Lily, which grows on top of the Shirui hills in Manipur and can only be found there. The festival aims to spread awareness and conserve the endangered state flower, while also providing an opportunity for people from various communities and tribes to come together and explore the picturesque Ukhrul district.

## Investment Opportunities in Sports & Entertainment Sector

Government of India is encouraging major investments in sports sector both in infrastructure development and human resource development in the Northeast.

• Sports Academy / Centre of Excellence / High-performance training centres: India's state-of-the-art sports facilities have played a significant role in the success of its athletes at international competitions, including the Olympics, Asian Games, and Commonwealth Games. However, despite 29% of Olympic medalists hailing from the Northeastern region, the area still lacks high-end, specialized training institutions. Athletes must travel to sports academies located in remote parts of the country, making it inaccessible and unaffordable for many aspiring talents. This gap in the market is an opportunity for the region to establish specialized training facilities, enabling athletes to showcase their talents and earn laurels.


# Private sector Investments Sports Academy / Centre of Excellence / High-performance training centres in NER

Centre of Excellence, Mizoram: The Centre of Excellence (CoE) is a residential football academy in Aizawl, Mizoram, supported by the Tata Trusts to groom promising Indian talent for international football. The Mizoram government and the Mizoram Football Association (MFA) are partners in the CoE project, which operates out of space granted by the Mizoram Police. Along with training in football techniques, the centre offers nutrition, physiotherapy, psychology and recovery sessions. Education continues every day so that the boys do not fall behind academically. English speaking classes are included in the curriculum. The catchment area for scouting talent includes the nearby states of Manipur, Meghalaya, Nagaland and Assam.

**Meghalaya Baby League**: Tata Trusts launched the Meghalaya Baby League (MBL) in May 2018 in partnership with the Meghalaya Football Association and the All India Football Federation. Organised into 12 teams, the players have played over 1,320 matches in the past one year. The success of the scheme is evidenced by the fact that the league has over 1,800 enthusiastic participants aged 4-13 years.

Mary Kom Boxing Academy: The Mary Kom-Sports Authority of India (SAI) Boxing Academy, founded in 2015, imparts coaching and provides lodging, food and bears costs during tournaments. Aiming to identify boxing talents between ages 12-18, the academy focuses on physical education and psychological developments. The academy is spread over an area 3.30 acres near Imphal.

**BBFS Residential Academy, Shillong**: Bhaichung Bhutia Football Schools (BBFS') Foundation program offers best-in-class football coaching at the grassroots and youth levels. The residential Academy is situated inside Assam Rifles Public School which is a Co-Ed School affiliated to the CBSE, New Delhi as well as a SAI designated Sports School under the "KHELO INDIA SCHEME". The BBFS' foundation program combines high intensity training practices within a scientifically planned curriculum to deliver training sessions that ensure each player develops his skills and physicality in the right manner.



Sports medicine centres / Sports science research institutes: In India, there is a growing recognition of the significance of sports science, as the government prioritizes the promotion of sports and physical activity. This has led to the establishment of various courses and degrees in sports coaching, management, medicine, and related fields by universities and institutes. Despite this emphasis, the entire Northeast region currently lacks sports medicine centers and sports science research institutes. This gap in the market presents an attractive investment opportunity for those seeking profitable growth prospects while supporting the development of sports in India. Investing in such facilities in the Northeast region could address the growing demand for sports-related infrastructure and services while positioning investors for long-term profitability. By taking advantage of this opportunity, investors can contribute to the growth of sports in India while securing profitable returns.



- Animation & VFX Industry: The Northeast region is also showing great potential for the Animation and VFX industry. In the past five years, there has been a rapid increase in the number of films produced in the region, as well as content developed for and based on the region. In 2018, the region produced a cumulative total of 24 films, which grew to 89 films in 2022, indicating a growing trend in film production in the region. With the increasing film production, there is a huge scope for investors to explore opportunities in the Animation and VFX industry. Currently, most producers in the region have to seek professional Animation and VFX services from outside the region. Furthermore, the youth in the region possess artistic talents that can be harnessed for this industry.
- Amusement Parks & Family Entertainment Zone (Like Park, Mall, Kid Zone etc): The amusement industry is growing all across the country. The size of the Indian Amusement Park business is estimated to be around Rs 4000 crores and is estimated to grow by 10% per cent per annum in next couple of years. The Northeast region (NER) of our country has only a few amusement parks, yet they are enjoying a thriving business, despite the limited facilities available. This indicates that the growth potential of the amusement and theme park industry in this region is substantial. Considering the tremendous growth potential of this industry in the upcoming years, it would be prudent for investors to explore the establishment of various types of amusement parks or family entertainment zones in the NER states. It is also worthwhile to consider replicating successful facilities like the Eco Park of Kolkata in Guwahati or other state capitals of the NER region.

Implementation of single window clearance portal in all the states of northeast for providing G2B services in a seamless timebound manner

- As a measure to create a conducive business eco system, the states of North East India have implemented one stop single window system for all G2B permits and permissions required for any business activity
- Among many other features of the single window system, a notable functionality in the system is Centralised Inspection Module which helps in random allocation of inspection inspectors and joint site inspection thereby reducing the time, procedure, and cost of many G2B services.

#### Integration with NSWS

- The North Eastern states have onboarded or are in the process of onboarding their G2B services in the National Single Window Portal. This will enable investors to easily apply for business clearances for their investments in the region.

- To attract investment in the NER, the states have proactively implemented Industrial Policies which offer state specific incentives.

#### Preferential land allotment policy through creating of Industrial Land Banks

- Each state in the north east has developed industrial land banks for ease of land allocation.
- > Sector specific Industrial Zones like Plastic Park, Textile Parks and IT Parks have been developed in the region.
