Furthermore, the NER is widely recognized as one of the most diverse



Key Economic Indicators

- The Region's GSDP at current prices is INR 5.75 lakh crore in FY 2021-22
- Compounded Annual Growth Rate (CAGR) of GSDP of North-eastern States grew at 08.17% from FY2015 to FY2022.
- Per capita income: The per capita income for the North-eastern region was Rs. 1,55,562 in the financial year 2019-20.
 Infrastructure: The region has a total of 13640 km of national highways.
- Infrastructure: 20119 km of state highways, and 2,657 km of major district roads.
- The average road density per 1000 Sq Km of area is 2258.5 Km against the national average of 1926.02 Km.

Government Incentives: A range of incentives, including tax holidays, subsidies, and reimbursements to support business growth.


Low-cost Manufacturing Hub: Low labour costs compared to other parts of India and the world.

Healthcare Sector in India

The healthcare sector in India offers investment opportunities in hospitals, medical equipment, clinical trials, telemedicine, out sourcing,medical tourism, health insurance, medical devices and pharmaceutical manufacturing. Healthcare has become one of the largest sectors of the Indian economy, in terms of both revenue and employment. It has been growing at a CAGR of 22% since 2016, employing 4.7 Million people directly. Several factors are driving the growth of the Indian healthcare sector including increased life expectancy, a growing middle class, the rising proportion of lifestyle diseases, an increased emphasis on public-private partnerships as well as accelerated adoption of digital technologies, including telemedicine, besides heightened interest from investors and increased FDI inflows over the last two decades.

- The Indian healthcare sector is expected to record a three-fold rise, growing at a CAGR of 22% between 2016–22 to reach US\$ 372 billion in 2022-23 from US\$ 110 billion in 2016.
- India's public expenditure on healthcare stood at 2.1% of GDP in 2021-22 against 1.8% in 2020-21 and 1.3% in 2019-20.
- In FY22, premiums underwritten by health insurance companies grew to Rs. 73,582.13 crore (US\$ 9.21 billion).
- The Indian medical tourism market was valued at US\$ 2.89 billion in 2020 and is expected to reach US\$ 13.42 billion by 2026. It is reported that close to 697,300 foreign tourists came for medical treatment in India in FY19.
- The e-health market size is estimated to reach US\$ 10.6 billion by 2025.

In 2023, the Government of India augmented the budgetary allocation for the life sciences and pharmaceutical sector to 2.1% of the country's GDP. This increase was reflected in the budgeted estimates, which rose from INR 77,351 crores in the revised estimate to INR 88,956 crores.

The focus areas of Budget 2023 are

- Research and innovation through centres of excellence for pharma
- Facilities being made available in select ICMR labs for research by medical college faculty and private sector- to promote collaborative R&D.
- Focus on health infrastructure by creating 157 new nursing colleges to be co-located in existing medical colleges.
- Multi-disciplinary courses for medical devices to upskill manpower for futuristic medical technologies, high-end manufacturing, and research.

Customs exemption for specified products required for the sector were extended:

- Current customs exemption for lifesaving drugs and specified drugs, medicines, diagnostic kits extended by two years up to 31 March 2025.
- Specified drugs and medicines supplied free of cost to patients under Patient Assistance Program, specified medical and surgical instruments, hospital equipment - extended by one year up to 31 March 2024.



Healthcare Sector in NER

The healthcare sector is an integral part of any region's development, and North East India is no exception. The region has made significant strides in recent years to improve its healthcare facilities and services. With a population of over 45 million people, the need for quality healthcare services is growing.

Access to Healthcare: North East India has seen significant improvement in this area. Many new hospitals and clinics have been established, and telemedicine services have been introduced to remote areas. The government has also initiated schemes to ensure healthcare accessibility for all.

The National Health Mission (NHM) and Ayushman Bharat-Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Yojana (AB-PMJAY) are two such schemes that have been introduced to improve access to healthcare services for the people of the region.

Under the Assam Cancer Care Foundation (ACCF), a collaboration between the Assam Government and Tata Trusts for setting up 17 cancer care units in the state, of which six were inaugurated in 2022.

Ayush & Wellness

The North Eastern Institute of Ayurveda & Homoeopathy (NEIAH), Shillong, Meghalaya is an autonomous institute newly established under the Ministry of AYUSH, Government of India. As part of the National AYUSH Mission (NAM) Scheme, a total of 1000 new Health & Wellness Centres (HWC), will be opened in the NE states for growth and development of AYUSH systems. The aim of these centres is to provide a holistic wellness model based on principles of AYUSH systems of medicine. To boost the popularity of traditional medicines provided by AYUSH, the minister announced setting up of 100 AYUSH dispensaries under NAM in the northeast region.

The Ministry of AYUSH has decided to upgrade the Government Ayurvedic College in Guwahati and develop it as a Centre of Excellence. Apart from this, a facilitation Centre for Semi Processing of raw material will be set up in NER. Regional Raw Drug Repository (RRDR) in NE states in collaboration with National Institute of Bio-Resources and Sustainable Development in Imphal, Manipur under Department of Bio-Technology. These initiatives will be undertaken under the Central Sector Scheme run by National Medicinal Plants Board, Ministry of AYUSH. The AYUSH medical facilities under North-Eastern State Governments, Central Government and teaching hospitals in AYUSH colleges will be brought under AYUSH Health Management Information System (AHMIS) to develop digital data base of AYUSH interventions in various disease management.

Tibetan medicine is a traditional system of medicine that has been practiced for over a thousand years in Tibet and the Himalayan regions of Nepal, Bhutan, and India. In recent years, Tibetan medicine has gained popularity in North Eastl India, where there is a significant Tibetan community. Tibetan medicine utilizes a range of therapies including herbal medicine, acupuncture, moxibustion, cupping, and massage

• In the hospital segment, the expansion of private players to Tier 3 and semi-urban locations, beyond metropolitan cities, offers an attractive investment opportunity.


